Fredericton Police Chief Roger Brown will be discussing leadership in policing. Mr. Brown joined the RCMP in 1980, serving in Quebec and Newfoundland. In 2008, he became the Commanding Officer of the RCMP Academy (Depot Division) until his transfer to New Brunswick in 2013, where he became the 29th Commanding Officer of the RCMP in New Brunswick (J Division). In his role of Commanding Officer, Mr. Brown oversaw the investigation into the murder of three Moncton RCMP officers in 2014. On June 4th, 2016, after a distinguished 36-year career, then Assistant Commissioner Brown retired from the RCMP. In 2019, he was appointed as chief of police for Fredericton, where he remained until his retirement in 2022.
